SCISWA Landfill & Transfer Station

SCISWA does not accept free-flowing liquids, hazardous wastes, or asbestos. Waste is accepted from residents of the Agency counties only (Lucas, Marion, Monroe and Poweshiek). All loads must be tarped and tied.

Minimum charge for the above is \$10 at the landfill and \$8 at the transfer station for loads up to 500 pounds.

Appliances _____ \$10 per item

Air conditioners, commercial coolers, dehumidifiers, dishwashers, freezers, furnaces, microwaves, stoves, PCB containing ballasts and capacitors, refrigerators, thermostats, washers, dryers, water heaters, other items determined by staff.

 More than 8 car/pickup tires _____ \$150 per ton
 Off-road/dirt-moving equipment tires \$300 per ton
 ___ *Note: This rate applies to all tires larger than farm rears.*

Recyclables _____ No charge

Accepted items: Paper, cardboard, plastics (#1 and #2)*, tin and aluminum cans, glass bottles, scrap metal, uncontaminated motor oil and filters, and clean rubber such as concrete and rock.

**The transfer station also accepts plastics #4, #5, and #7.*

Cover Up

ALL loads coming into the landfill or transfer station must be covered (tarped) and secured (tied) from the time you leave your home or business until you reach the landfill.

A surcharge will be assessed if you are found to be in violation of this regulation.

Did you know ...

- Alkaline and carbon zinc household batteries can be thrown in the trash.
- Latex paint can be thrown in the trash if it has been properly dried out. To dry, and add kitty litter or saw dust. Remove lid before disposing.
- It is NOT safe to throw Compact Fluorescent Lightbulbs (CFLs) in the trash—they contain mercury. SCISWA recycles CFLs through its Household Hazardous Waste program.



About SCISWA

The South Central Iowa Solid Waste Agency (SCISWA) is an intergovernmental agency serving Lucas, Marion, Monroe, and Poweshiek Counties and the city of Victor in Iowa County. The agency operates a Transfer Station located near Malcom in Poweshiek County where garbage is collected and then transported via transfer trailer to the landfill in Marion County.
